

FAMILY SERVICES ADMINISTRATION

FSA PROGRAMS

Homeless Services Program – Ensures that shelter services, transitional housing and permanent supportive housing and case management are provided to homeless individuals and families in the District of Columbia.

Strong Families Program – Provides comprehensive service delivery to families who are experiencing social, emotional, or other issues that create ongoing challenges in their lives through case management and other support services.

Community Services Block Grant Program – Funds the operations of district-wide network of community and faith-based, non-profit organizations to identify the causes of poverty and proposes ways to reduce poverty in the District of Columbia.

Adult Protective Services – Investigates alleged abuse, neglect, self neglect and exploitation of frail elderly and disabled adults, and intervenes to protect vulnerable adults who are at risk.

Family Violence Prevention Services – Funds safe shelter and related services for survivors of domestic violence and provides outreach and education about domestic violence to underserved populations.

Teen Parent Assessment Program – Assesses the living arrangements of teen parents applying for or receiving TANF benefits and provides case management to teens on TANF to help them move toward self-sufficiency.

Refugee Resettlement Services – Supports refugees through the provision of employment services, cash and medical assistance and other support services to help them move toward self-sufficiency.

DC Fatherhood Initiative – Administers competitive grants for non-profit, community and faith-based organizations to develop and implement projects that support healthy marriages, responsible parenting and economic stability amongst low-income DC residents.
